This year, we focused on improving our students' ability in developing the mental math computations, we continued to focus on student well-being and self-regulation skills and our students have made gains in all those areas. We also worked on developing a growth mindset in our students and encouraging positive learning attitudes. With the addition of iPads in our school – bringing our ratio almost to a 1:1 ratio of iPads to students - we emphasized effective use of technology to enhance student work.

We continued to encourage our students on a daily basis to be responsible and caring individuals who help their families, school and community. During the June awards ceremony, we celebrated student success, noting that we believe each student has the potential to be successful. We also recognized the numerous students who help out in the school with lunch supervision, morning announcements, the breakfast program, and the fruit and vegetable program.

SCHOOL MATERIALS - Optional

Although we provide most items, with the exception of shoes, the following is a <u>suggested</u> list of school materials if you wish to personalize your child's belongings.

Junior and Senior Kindergarten

- Change of clothes in case of accidents (this clothing can be kept in the classroom)
- A classroom newsletter will be sent during the summer, to families, indicating specific items.

Grades 1 - 6

- A pair of indoor athletic shoes with non-marking soles
- A sturdy school bag for books
- A sturdy lunch bag

- HB pencils with sharpener

- Two boxes of facial tissues
